4b. Title of Event: Educational Tour

**Date:** 6 March 2024

An Educational Tour to a few Delhi Monuments was undertaken on 06.03.2024. A group of 17 BA prog students were accompanied by 02 teachers, Prof. Yuthika Mishra and Ms. Gopika Bhandari. The Van was provided by the college. The objective of the tour was to provide an overview of Delhi's history to the students. The group first visited Firoz Shah Kotla, the highlights being the the Kotla mosque and the Ashokan pillar located on the premises. Subsequently the students visited the Tughlaqababd mausoleum, constructed of finely cut red sandstone and white marble, which houses Ghiasuddin's tomb along with that of his son and wife. After that, the remarkable, massive stone fortifications of Tughlaqabad fort drew everyone's attention and the group explored many structures located inside including the Vijaymandal. The students also gained a glimpse of the Adilabad fort as well as the Nai ka Kot located at a short distance from there. The last to be visited was the Mehrauli complex in the heart of the Quila Rai Pithora. Around the Qutb the students studied important monuments like the Mehrauli pillar of Chandragupta II Vikramaditya, the remains of the temples, the Minar itself, Iltutmish's tomb, the magnificent Alai darwaza and Alauddin's Madarsa.



#### 4c. Excursion Trip to Jim Corbett National Park-Nainital

A four-day excursion trip from 4<sup>th</sup> October to 7<sup>th</sup> October 2024 to Jim Corbett National Park-Nainital was organized by the Department of Commerce for 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year 43 commerce students along with Teacher In-charge Dr. Subhashree Bose, and faculty members, Dr. Shafaq Zareen, Ms. Shilpa, Ms. Shivani Kalra and Ms. Meenu to promote learning through outdoor experiences. The students were accompanied by Dr. Shafaq Zareen, Ms. Rachna Megh and Ms. Sakshi Meena. The session was conducted by Ms. Uzma Mumtaz, Entrepreneurship Mentor, NSIC. The students were given an insight about the working of NSIC, its role for new startups, easy to implement strategies, reasons for failure of start-ups and various Government schemes to promote and support new entrepreneurs. The visit included a tour of the incubator center of NSIC, where students get a live demonstration of making tissue paper rolls, paper napkin, paper plate making, pet bottle making, spice grinder machine for grinding spices, bread making machine, biscuit making, garlic paste making etc. Various aspects of it like cost per unit, production, operation and packaging was discussed. #### Part A: Career Counselling Sessions
