#### Strategic Plan

The college strives to foster holistic student development through the spirit of Swami Vivekananda. Over the years, students from both graduate and post graduate programs have performed excellently under the tutelage of the institution. With changing times, the institution has, at regular intervals, augmented resources available for the students. Most recently, the global epidemic has taught us the value of being adaptable and flexible, in the face of consistently shifting unprecedented circumstances. With these considerations in mind, the college strategy concentrates mainly on three areas:

#### A) Academic Excellence and Research:

- 1. The institution will promote academic excellence by encouraging student-centric teaching and implementing digital pedagogies in the classroom.



## Report of Seminar on "Cyber Law"

" You must be the change if you wish to see in the world ".


On the serene morning of 30<sup>th</sup> January, 2024 an informative seminar on the topic of "Cyber Law" was conducted by the Social Outreach and Community Development Committee in collaboration with the Delhi State Legal Services Authority. The speaker for the day was Ms. Shisba Chawla who's on record advocate in the Supreme Court of India.

The seminar was conducted to address the growing challenges and legal implications in the digital landscape. She enlightened the students about various types of cyber laws that are taking place around us like phishing, impersonation, online squatting hacking, cyberstalking and identity theft. She encouraged the participants to take necessary action after they face any of these crimes. She mentioned the toll-free number 1930 which works specifically for this purpose.

She also shared a few of her experiences to make the session more interactive and interesting.

The Cyber Law seminar provided a valuable platform for participants to deepen their understanding of the legal aspects of cyberspace. The event contributed to fostering a collaborative approach to address the complex challenges posed by cybercrimes and adapt to the digital environment's dynamic nature.



#### • Seminar and conferences:

On April 12, 2024, IQAC at Vivekananda College organized a talk on women-related laws, coordinated by Dr. Gargi Sengupta and Dr. Sheetal, with guest speaker Ms. Shishba Chawla, Advocate-On-Record at the Supreme Court. She explained critical legal frameworks, including the Dowry Prohibition Act, PoSH Act, Domestic Violence Act, and related IPC provisions, while cautioning against their misuse. The session also covered cybercrimes targeting women and the role of the Internal Complaints Committee. About 80 students attended, and a Q&A session further clarified their understanding. The event successfully raised awareness among women students.




