

1. Gandhi Jayanti

1a. Through activities like celebrating **Gandhi Jayanti** (on 10th October, 2023) **Gandhi Study Circle** encourages students and employees to recognize their duties as responsible citizens, fostering tolerance and national unity. Eighteen students participated in the event offering musical performance and showcasing their speaking skills through speeches and poetry.







1b. The **Creative Writing Club** of Vivekananda College, Ehsaas organised a creative writing Competition "Remembering Mahatma" on 12 October 2023, Thursday at 12:15 PM in Room No. 21 to commemorate Gandhi Jayanti. 

Participants were asked to flip the sticky notes to educate them about the empathetic translations. Furthermore, various resources about suicide prevention provided by Outlive were displayed on a separate desk. The activity received an abundance of love and appreciation. The students showed a keen interest in the pamphlets and self-help materials available at the desk.


8. Diwali celebrations




11 Constitution Day






