

INTERNAL QAULITY ASSURANCE CELL TALK ON WOMEN RELATED LAWS REPORT



The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Vivekananda College, University of Delhi organized a talk on the topic "women related laws" on 12th April 2024 at Sharda Hall, to increase awareness among the students. The faculty coordinators for the event were Dr.Gargi Sengupta and Dr.Sheetal. The guest speaker for the talk was Ms.Shishba Chawla. She is an Advocate-On-Record at Supreme court of India. The event began at 10:00 am.

Ms.Shishba Chwala discussed with the students various laws for the protection of women such as Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961; Protection of Women from Sexual Harassment Act, 2013 (PoSH); The Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005 and the various provisions mentioned in IPC (Indian Penal Code) for protection of Women.

She also mentioned about the measures to be taken if one experience any of these and not to misuse these laws. she also discussed about the increasing cybercrimes happening with women in recent times and steps to be taken to combat these. The importance of ICC in such issues was also highlighted.

The session concluded with some questions from the students to enhance their understanding about the laws. The event was attended by around 80 students of Vivekananda College. In all the session enriched the students and was a step towards creating awareness among women students.

VIVEKANANDA COLLEGE, UNIVERSITY OF DELHI, an educational institution, situated at VIVEK VIHAR, DELHI 110 095, hereinafter referred to as Vivekananda College (which term shall mean and include wherever the context so requires or admits, its successors and permitted assigns) of the OTHER PART

Both BSG and Vivekananda College are individually referred to as 'Party' and collectively as 'Parties'

WHEREAS:

Delt

- A. BSG is an organization engaged in the promotion of peace, cultural and education activities across India, spread over 600 towns and cities.
- B. Vivekananda College is an educational institution engaged in teaching-learning as per the guidelines of the University of Delhi.
- C. Towards achieving the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), BSG has launched various activities under a concentrated initiative namely 'BSG FOR SDG'.
- D. As part of 'BSG FOR SDG', BSG seeks to set up SDG CLUBS in different institutions, as a platform for students in the institutions to learn about the SDGs together, formulate solutions to contribute to the SDGs on a daily basis through sustainable human behaviour, thereby creating a culture of sustainability.
- E. Vivekananda College is one such institution which has expressed its willingness to collaborate with BSG for creation of an SDG CLUB in Vivekananda College.
- F. In pursuance of the aforesaid, the Parties wish to enter into this MoU to record their mutual understanding for the purpose specified above.

NOW THEREFORE THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS UNDER:

- PURPOSE: A collaboration for setting up of an SDG Club (hereinafter referred to as 'the Club'), comprising primarily of students in Vivekananda College as its members, to conduct activities listed out in Clause 3 hereunder.
- DURATION: This binding MoU shall be valid for a period of one (1) year, till __.03.2024. This duration may be mutually extended by the Parties in writing.
- 3. SCOPE OF ACTIVITIES: The Club shall play the primary role in conducting activities towards promoting the SDGs in Vivekananda College, including but not limited to:
 - (i) Conducting regular monthly/bi-monthly meetings among its members to discuss various aspects of SDGs, expand their knowledge on SDGs and on daily actions for the same.
 - (ii) Organizing exhibitions, seminars, guest lectures and workshops to raise awareness on the SDGs through sustainable human behaviour, among the students and teachers within Vivekananda College.

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(iii) Other such activities as mutually agreed by the Parties from time to time, in writing.

A suggested list of activities forms ANNEXURE-I to this MoU.

- 4. ROLE OF BSG IN CONDUCT OF ACTIVITIES: BSG may, in conjunction with Vivekananda College, support the activities of the Club in the following manner:
 - (i) Organizing training/orientation for the SDG Club members to conduct the activities of the Club.
 - (ii) Suggesting the agenda/content of the meetings of the Club.
 - (iii) Providing materials/resources on SDGs such as short films/essays, etc.
 - (iv) Inviting guests for seminars, guest lectures and workshops from time to time.
 - (v) Discussing and formulating new ideas with Vivekananda College, to further the SDG initiatives in Vivekananda College.
 - (vi) Offering certificates to SDG Club members, as desired by Vivekananda College.
- 5. ROLE OF Vivekananda College: Vivekananda College shall:
 - (i) Create the SDG Club.
 - (ii) Regularly review the functioning of the SDG Club.
 - (iii) Provide logistical support for proper conduct of activities of the SDG Club in Vivekananda College.
 - (iv) Share periodic reports for discussion with BSG about the functioning of the SDG Club.
 - (v) Share letters of commendation for any of the activities of the SDG Club, as requested by BSG.
- 6. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTIES:
 - (i) Each Party shall be the sole and exclusive owner of the Intellectual Property Rights of the materials/resources shared with the other Party.
 - (ii) The other Party agrees and undertakes that it shall not claim any right, title or interest in such materials/resources or any other intellectual property that is associated or related thereof, unless expressly assigned to it.
 - (iii) Further, the Intellectual Property Rights arising due to any collaborative research or activity under this MoU shall be worked out on a case-to-case basis.
- 7. EXPENDITURES: In the event any expenditure is incurred for any of the activities listed in Clause 3 of this MoU, the same shall be borne by the parties as mutually agreed to in advance.
- 8. EXCLUSIVITY: The SDG Club and the activities carried thereof shall be exclusive to the Parties to this MoU.

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- 10. CONFIDENTIALITY OBLIGATIONS: All information exchanged between the Parties under this MoU (except information as is publicly available), shall be considered Confidential Information. For the purpose of this Clause, the Party that discloses Confidential Information to the other Party shall be referred to as the **Disclosing Party**, and the party that receives such Confidential Information shall be referred to as the **Receiving Party**. The **Receiving Party** shall not disclose such Confidential Information to any third party, without the **Disclosing Party**'s express written consent.
- SURVIVAL: The provisions of Clauses 6, 8, 9 & 10 shall survive the expiration of this MoU.

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Suggested Activities of the SDG Clubs

Frequency: Monthly/Bi-Monthly (Based on different SDGs/Related Theme for each meeting)

- 1. <u>Short Videos:</u> BSG can share a repository of short videos on each SDG and interrelatedness of SDGs. These videos can be shared with the students as part of awareness campaign
- Student Testimonials/discussions: Students can be encouraged to engage in healthy discussion on the SDGs/Related Theme of the meeting. A few can also share the actions that they are taking towards SDGs
- 3. <u>Presentations on the theme</u>: The Club members can put together a presentation on the theme of the month and show their creative talent.
- 4. <u>Discussion on 'Book of the Month'</u>: A discussion/review of the 'Book of the month' can be done among the club students. The broad points of the review can be shared with a larger group to encourage reading. BSG can help to create a list of books on different topics.
- 5. <u>Street Play</u>: Theme based short street plays highlighting the 'Power of One' to contribute to SDGs can be organized.
- 6. <u>Art Competition:</u> Art competition encouraging students to express their vision for the future. Paintings can be theme based. An 'Art Corner' can be created for these paintings which resonate with the monthly theme.
- 7. Debate competition: Debates/Discussion to discuss various aspects of SDGs.
- 8. <u>Workshops</u>: Workshop with SDG Experts from various fields. The group can engage in intensive discussion and activities based on a particular subject or project. BSG can help in getting experts for the workshops.
- 9. <u>SDG themed Periodic Events</u>: Students of the SDG Club can take the lead and create the agenda for the periodic event to spread awareness. They can share their learning/ppts/videos/etc with a larger group of students
- 10. Essay competition: Writing competitions based on the theme of the month can be



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
- Special Drives for the month: Student led special drive for the institute can be held. The club members can choose from a variety of topics and also create activities for the drive.
- 12. Inter-institute events: Inter-institute events can be organized within the campus etc to promote awareness for a larger group
- **13. SDG Website:** Students can be encouraged to create SDG website or SDG magazine for the institute to capture their activities and to share with a larger audience.

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Memorandum of Understanding

This Memorandum of Understanding is made on this 2^{2} day of September 2023 at New Delhi by and between:

1. Vivekananda College, Vivek Vihar, New Delhi – 110092, a constituent college of Delhi University, hereinafter referred to as "The College"

And

- 2. Delhi Elites Football Academy, through its sole proprietor, Ayush Bhuttan, with its office at P-31/b2, Dilshad Garden, Delhi 110095, hereinafter referred to as "The Academy"
- a. Whereas, the Academy is passionate about football and believes in India's youth potential, and aims to help the youth realise and nurture this potential to excel in football.
- b. And whereas, the Academy aims to create a space where budding football talent can learn the nuances of the game and have ample opportunities of practice.
- c. And whereas, as part of this football Academy's mission, the Academy aims to initiate training from the grassroots for children and young adults.
- d. And whereas, the Academy aims to help children and young adults evolve as physically fit, mentally agile and strategically adept individuals, not just in football but in life as a whole.
- e. And whereas, the Academy organises regular tournaments to develop footballing skills and foster a spirit of healthy competition, which is necessary for success in any field.
- f. And whereas, the College is possessed of a playing field on the college premises where the Academy wishes to hold training sessions and tournaments.
- g. And whereas, the College is willing to permit the use of the playground aforementioned on the terms and conditions herein.

Terms and Conditions

- 1. Schedule and Operation
 - a. Days of operation: the Academy shall operate from Monday to Saturday.
 - D. Timing: the Academy shall have the right to utilise the Playground between 4:30 PM to 7:30 PM on the Days of Operation. The Academy shall ensure that the Playground is vacated, and its personnel and equipment removed by 7:30 PM on the day of play.
 - c. Tournaments: may be conducted by the Academy on Sundays, provided that 7daysnotice thereof is provided to the College, and the Playground is not required for any official business of the College.
 - d. The primary operations of the College shall take precedence, where they conflict with the timings of the Academy, provided that a notice of 30 days is provided to the Academy for any change in this regard.

- e. This Memorandum of Understanding shall come in effect and remain in operation for a term of 2 years from the date of its execution, subject to the provisions of Clause 7.
- **User charges**

- a. The Academy shall pay a monthly user charge of 20,000 + GSTE184. (amount in words) for the first 3 months.
- b. After the expiry of 3 months, the Academy shall pay a monthly user charge of 2.5.0001 + 6.572 (amount in words).
- c. The user charge shall be paid by the Academy to the College via electronic transfer of funds by the 5th of every month to the bank account stipulated as under:

- d. The aforementioned user charges shall be payable, irrespective of actual days of use of the Playground by the Academy.
- e. The College shall have the right to prevent access of the Academy to the College premises and/or the Playground, when the aforementioned user charges have not been paid by the Academy, till such time as full and proper payment is not made.
- **Facilities and Permissions**
 - a. The College shall make available for use by the Academy its playground and changing and washroom facilities appurtenant thereto (collectively referred to as "Playground") in accordance with Clause 1.
 - b. The Academy shall have the right to utilise the Playground for the purpose of training sessions for football and tournaments. The Academy shall not utilise the Playground for any other purposes.
 - c. The Academy shall ensure that its personnel and students do not enter other buildings or access other areas on the College premises.
 - d. The Academy may install football-related equipment on the playing field.
 - e. The Academy, its personnel and students may access changing rooms, washrooms and hydration facilities. The Academy shall ensure that at the end of every day's play, the changing rooms, washrooms and hydration facilities are vacated in clean and good condition, and no equipment and belongings are left behind.
 - f. The Academy may, at its sole risk and expense, utilise storage space in the College to store equipment and materials. The said storage may be identified by mutual consent of the Academy and the College.
 - g. The Academy may utilise specific areas of the College premises for display of banners, posters and flyers. All locations of display must be approved by the College. All display material must be removed by the Academy within 2 days of the conclusion of the event promoted.
 - h. It is expressly stipulated that no property right is being transferred from the College to the Academy by means of this Memorandum of Understanding.

Responsibilities and liabilities

a. The Academy shall ensure that any property of the College utilised by the Academy is maintained in good condition, subject to ordinary wear and tear. The Academy shall be solely liable for any damage caused to the property of the College due to its use by the Academy.

5. Indemnification

- a. The Academy hereby agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the College on account of any taxes, cess, or any other charges including any penalties that may be imposed by any statutory central, state, municipal, regulatory, quasi-judicial and/or local authorities as a result of the Academy's use of the College premises. Should the College be compelled, in order to continue its operations, to make payment for any statutory tax, cess, charge, due, levy, penalty or other outgoing by whatsoever name called, the Academy will indemnify and hold the College harmless for the same, pending which the College may recover the same by way of legal proceedings, at the Academy's expense.
- b. The Academy shall be solely liable for any injuries or incidents or property damage that occur as a result of its operations and/or use of the College premises, irrespective of the identity of the injured party. The Academy shall indemnify and hold harmless the College on account of all claims and/or proceedings that may be instituted in this regard.
- c. The provisions of Clause 5 shall survive the termination or expiry of this Memorandum of Understanding.

6. Record keeping

- a. List of coaches/staff and players: the Academy shall provide a list of coaches/support staff and participants, along with necessary identification documents, who shall access the premises of the College for any purpose connected with the operations of the Academy.
- b. Maintenance of register: the Academy shall maintain a detailed register of all participants, and provide a copy thereof to the College on a monthly basis.

7. Termination and Renewal

- a. Termination: either party may terminate this Memorandum of Understanding without cause by providing a written notice of 90 days.
- b. In case of serious misconduct/complaint, the College shall have the right to immediately terminate the operations of the Academy without any prior notice.
- c. Renewal: this Memorandum of Understanding may be renewed by the mutual consent of the parties, expressed in writing, at least 30 days before the expiry of this Memorandum of Understanding.

8. Dispute Redressal

- a. Any dispute or difference that arises out of or in connection with this Memorandum of Understanding shall be addressed by the parties through dialogue and discussion within a period of 30 days. If the said dispute or difference remains unresolved, the parties may collectively opt for mediation of the dispute, prior to initiation of legal proceedings.
- b. The competent courts at Delhi shall have sole and exclusive jurisdiction with respect to any dispute that arises out of or in connection with this Memorandum of Understanding.

a. The Academy shall comply with all applicable laws pertaining to its operation, and the College shall not be responsible for any failure on the part of the Academy to comply with applicable law.

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b. The Academy shall comply with regulations imposed by the competent sports authorities and/or local authorities.

10. Amendment

a. Amendments: Any amendment to this Memorandum of Understanding shall only be executed jointly by the Parties in writing, under their hand and signature, with the consent of both Parties.

University of Buraimi, Sultanate of Oman

Cooperation in the areas of study and educational services

Desiring to establish collaborative relations between the two institutions to promote friendship and to co-operate in a mutually beneficial association, the two institutions have agreed that:

- 1. The two institutions shall encourage co-operation in any discipline which is studied in both the institutions.
- 2. The two institutions shall seek to promote :
 - exchange of information and academic materials that are of mutual interest
 - exchange between the two institutions relating to :
 - academic faculty and administrative staff
 - research staff
 - visiting scholars
 - students
 - other staff mutually agreed upon
 - conducting Seminars/Webinars/Conferences/Workshops/Training Programs
 - conducting collaborative research projects
 - any other related programs and cultural programs
 - provision of briefing/orientation services by each institution for visitors from the other institution
 - Other forms of co-operation which the two institutions may jointly arrange.

Details of any such activities will be subject to a subsequent detailed separate Agreement that will be mutually entered into and will be attached to this MoU as an annexure.

3. The two institutions shall decide through consultation the specific areas and details of co-operation within the framework of this Agreement, and shall consult from time to

The financial arrangements involved in the implementation of this Agreement shall be settled through consultation between the two institutions in respect of each program of co-operation for which separate Agreement shall be signed after obtaining appropriate approval from relevant competent authorities of each party.
- 5. The Agreement shall become operative on the last date indicated hereunder and shall remain in force for a period of Five (5) years with an option to renew for similar period.
- 6. This Agreement may be amended by mutual consent of the parties in writing and supplemented by detailed subsequent agreement between the two institutions. Amendments and or supplements will be appended as an annexure.
- 7. Either institution may terminate this Agreement by giving six (6) months prior notice in writing to the other institution. The rights and liabilities of the parties with respect to any ongoing project/training/exchanges shall remain unaffected by the termination. The same shall be completed as if no such termination has taken place. For conditions not covered by this Agreement, or for problems that arise during the course of this Agreement, both parties undertake to refrain from unilateral action and to consult and negotiate mutually acceptable decisions.
- 8. The institutions shall confer concerning the renewal of this Memorandum of Understanding six (6) months prior to the date of expiration.
