

Minutes of the Meeting held on 23.1.2021

In light of the meeting of the COVID-19 Task Force Committee members on 22.01.2021 and the meeting with all faculty members on 23.01.2021 at 11:30 am in the virtual mode (<u>https://meet.google.com/uqq-gwsx-see</u>), the following decisions were taken:

Faculty members will speak to the students and then formulate the decision at the department level to decide whether there is a need for practical classes in the physical mode for III year students only of their departments. If yes, then they may form groups and decide the days for the conduct of practical's. Keeping in mind the norms of physical distancing, the number of students who can be present will be regulated in each laboratory/facility. For the first two weeks, classes may be considered in the physical mode to meet only the vital academic needs of Final Year students which cannot be met through virtual mode.

Decision on departments who wish to hold consultative meetings with students of I and II years will be taken only after the data regarding groups of practical classes is received, and may be fixed in the latter half of February, if considered feasible.


For the library, the Librarian shall make protocols as per requirement and the same shall be communicated to the students and faculty members.

Efforts would be made to contact the parents and inform them of the decisions such as through a notice/appeal letter. Each department may hold a meeting with the parents along with a member of the Covid-19 Task Force Committee Member between 25th-30th January 2021. Students would be told clearly that there was no compulsion to attend, nor would they be penalized for not being able to come to college. It was purely voluntary. They would also have to ensure that they did not have any symptoms of COVID-19, and that they followed all prescribed guidelines.

The TICs are requested to communicate the decision of their respective department latest by the evening of Monday, 25.01.2021 so that the Task Force members can prepare the ground for gradual re-opening of the college. The names of faculty members and students of a particular group, and the date and time slot that they wish to come to college should be communicated.

- (h) Every College / Department / Center must satisfy themselves with the COVID-19 protocols by adopting preventive/safety measures and strictly following the SOPs as per the DDMA Guidelines F.60/DDMA/COVI-19/2021/463 dated 30.08.2021 (Annexure-1) and other provisions mentioned in the UGC Guidelines D.O. 14-8/2020 (CPP-II) Dated 05.11.2020 (Annexure-2).

Subject: UGC guidelines for Re-Opening the Universities and Colleges Post Lockdown due to COVID-19 Pandemic

Respected Madam /Sir,

Universities and other educational institutions across the country have been closed since 16th March, 2020 when the Government of India announced a countrywide lockdown as one of the measures to contain the COVID-19 outbreak. Keeping in view of the COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent lockdown, the University Grants Commission issued "Guidelines on Examinations and Academic Calendar for the Universities in View of Covid-19 pandemic and subsequent Lockdown" on 29th April, 2020 and then, on 6th July, 2020. The universities and colleges have put in their best efforts to continue their academic programmes and complete the syllabi using various ICT tools of teaching and learning since their closure from mid-March onwards.

The new academic session is going on and the universities and colleges need a customized plan, as per the local conditions where they are located, to deal with any eventuality arising due the COVID -19before resuming the activities on campuses. The top priority, while opening the institutions, should be the safety, health and well-being of the students, teachers and staff. In view of this, UGC has framed "Guidelines for Re-Opening the Universities and Colleges Post Lockdown due to COVID-19 Pandemic" (Annexure-I) which provide in detail the measures to be taken before re-opening of campuses. These Guidelines have also been vetted by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare and approved by the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Ministry of Education. The Guidelines may be adopted by the institutions as per the local conditions and directives of the Government authorities.

You are requested to adopt these guidelines and take necessary steps to implement them accordingly. Further, the universities/colleges have to ensure that it is prepared in all respects to carry out the academic activities following necessary advisories / guidelines / directions issued by the Central / State Government, Ministry of Education (MoE) or UGC from time to time to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Experiences of Mental Health Practitioners and Clients during COVID Pandemic in India

ABSTRACT

The study attempted to understand perspectives of mental health practitioners (Phase 1) and changes in presenting symptoms of clients with pre-existing mental health disorders during the pandemic (Phase 2). Semi structured questionnaires were used to obtain data from practitioners and case study method was used to study the client stories. In phase 1, several emerging themes were identified: changing roles of mental health services; challenges of online and face-to-face mental health services; need for new and evolved approaches to mental health services; and impact on mental health professionals. In phase 2, it was observed that symptoms worsened in dysfunctional family environments. Those with stronger family support systems, those using creative arts to express themselves and sought therapy saw an improvement.

The spread of COVID 19 continues and has resulted in widespread psychological distress in people all over the world. The management of these psychological problems requires an efficient mental health system. However, India lacked such an efficient system to tackle these problems even during pre-COVID days (e.g., Barua, 2009; Bhola, Kumaria, & Orlinsky 2012; Jain & Sandhu, 2013). Many researchers have pointed to the urgent need for developing indigenous models, but the progress has been rather slow (Arulmani, 2007).

The emergence of COVID in India has put a strain on an already fragile mental health system. Many mental health practitioners are feeling the need to adapt their practices to the current scenario of the pandemic. The need to reduce in-person sessions and increase telemental health services is pressing but few guidelines and training courses exist within the Indian setting. Some use of such services during the pre-COVID days has been reported in the literature (e.g. Malhotra et al., 2017, Naskar et al., 2017; Thara, John & Rao, 2008). Some have emphasized the beneficial aspects of online services (Miu, 2020) while others

Abstract

This study assesses the experiences of people in Delhi during the first nationwide lockdown in the context of coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. Forty-five participants between the age group 45-60 were selected from Delhi to assess their experiences during the first lockdown. The lockdown essentially forced people to stay at home and they could go out only for essential services. The analysis of the people's responses was carried out between the 8th and 15th day of the first Lockdown (24th March, 2020 to April 14th, 2020). An open-ended questionnaire was used to collect data from participants regarding their social psychological responses of the current circumstances. The people's responses were mostly positive though a few reported signs of anxiety and depression during the initial phases of the pandemic.

Unlocking Education: a Paradigm Shift

15th July 2021

The seminar was organized virtually via 'Google meet' from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm on 15th July 2021. It was also broadcasted on Facebook live with total participants/beneficiaries reaching around 250.

The inaugural session commenced with an invocation to God. Subsequently, a welcome speech was delivered by Dr Hina Nandrajog, Officiating Principal of Vivekananda College and Dr. Dipok Bora, Principal of Government Model College where both of them gave a brief description about their respective colleges followed by which a short glimpse of the campuses were also presented to the participants. Dr. Sukhneet Suri, Convenor of Covid-19 Task Force and Vidya Vistar committee of Vivekananda College, appraised dignitaries and participants about the objectives of the seminar. She shared the experiences of students and faculty when they shifted from offline mode to a completely online mode of teaching-learning, almost skipping the blended learning mode during the Covid 19 pandemic. She focused on the New Education policy and its impact on students. The seminar was then declared open for participants by Dr Suri. To enhance cultural bonding between the two colleges, an Assamese folk song was performed by students of Government Model College. The Chief Guest of the event was Dr. Atishi Marlena Singh, Senior Educationist. She talked about salient past and future transformations in higher education with special emphasis on the role of public investment towards quality education.

The Guest of Honour was Dr Rajeev Gupta, Dean of Student Welfare, University of Delhi. He appreciated the initiative taken by the college and emphasized the importance of education on personal growth and personality development. Mr. Munish Kaushik, Chairperson, Governing Body, Vivekananda College talked about the challenges faced by the economically weaker section in pursuing online education in the wake of the covid-19 pandemic and also focused on the inefficiencies of the current education system. He also drew attention towards the lessons that one can draw from the Northeastern region of India, who exhibit high resilience and continue to provide education despite challenging circumstances.

The inaugural session was followed by two technical sessions. The first technical session was graced by Professor Vandana Singh, School of Education, IGNOU and Dr Pranjal Buragohain, Dibrugarh University, where both enlightened the audience with their valuable thoughts on the impact of Covid-19 on education and the present generation, covering various aspects affecting the holistic growth of students. Prof. Vandana Singh also focused on three elements of

education during COVID 19 pandemic i.e. recovery, response and readiness. She also addressed the transitions in the education system evident so far due to the pandemic, salient issues, and the solutions required to curb the problems and finally concluded with a suggestion to adopt a blended learning approach.

The second technical session was further divided into two categories, The first category called for Paper Presentations by faculty members, Ph.D and post graduate students belonging to various academic institutions and the second category catered to Essay presentations by undergraduate students. A total of twenty one participants from diverse academic backgrounds and regions talked about challenges and solutions to achieve higher learning outcomes in the prevailing circumstances, equity and equality under virtual learning and infrastructural challenges for the new normal. The seminar enlightened the audience about the problems with the current education system, its inefficiencies and how to curb them, its achievement till now and how society can develop an ideal education system with the inclusion of a plethora of subjects, discovered and needed due to the growing globalisation and modernisation. It also provided a platform to the students where they can share their ideologies and insightful thoughts regarding education and hence it got an overwhelming response from both students and faculty.

The Technical session was followed by a Valedictory session where the results were declared. In the oral paper presentation category (faculty/phd/PG student) Ms Chayanika Lahkar, Ms Gitali Das and Ms. Ifra Rehman received the first, second and third positions respectively. In the UG (Essay) category, Ms Priyanshi Bhatnagar, Ms Snehil Sachan and Ms Prerna Dash won the first, second and third positions respectively. Finally the valedictory session was concluded with a Vote of Thanks by Dr Hina Nandrajog, Dr Sukhneet Suri and Ms. Vishakha Goyal.

The success of the seminar can be attributed to the enthusiastic attitude of the participants, organising team and student volunteers with the support and efforts of the teaching and non-teaching staff of Vivekananda College.
